Empowerment Center: Holistic Growth and Independence

Recognizing that awareness-raising alone cannot prevent human trafficking, we took a momentous step and opened the Empowerment Center. Here, survivors and at-risk women and girls from the community of Seeta find a sanctuary of hope, armed with employable skills and critical mental health support. We believe in nurturing holistic growth - mind, body, spirit, and heart - enabling survivors to regain control, independence, and minimize the risks of re-exploitation.

The impact of the Empowerment Center has been profound. Over 200 women have participated in our women empowerment program, forging new paths of empowerment. Additionally, approximately 5,000 villagers have been enlightened through our interventions in human trafficking, environmental awareness, and climate change education, igniting a ripple effect of change throughout the community.

Transforming Lives Through Skill Upgradation



At Footprint to Freedom, we are committed to transforming youth into skilled and productive members of society. Our Skill Upgradation Program has successfully converted 286 young individuals, equipping them with vital skills to secure brighter futures. Through our remedial education project, we have trained 321 survivors and youth in eMarketing, computer literacy, sustainable sewing, art and craft, and entrepreneurship, empowering them with tools for sustainable livelihoods.





Increased community awareness, improved knowledge about human trafficking, and the development of prevention strategies among community members.







- 3.Consulting with UN University Center for Research (Case Study -Ghana): Footprint to Freedom had the honor of collaborating with the UN University Center for Research, focusing on a case study centered in Ghana. Through this collaboration, we gained valuable insights and expertise, enhancing our efforts to combat trafficking and promote sustainable solutions.
- 4.Engaging Change Makers on SDGs Vision 2030: Our organization worked closely with 22 change makers, including community leaders, government officials, journalists, and police officers, to align our efforts with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Vision 2030. Recognizing the immense value they bring to our programs, FTF aims to secure sustainable funding to provide them with the compensation they deserve, ensuring their vital expertise continues to empower others on their journey to freedom.
- Expanding Outreach in Rural Areas: Our commitment to reaching vulnerable communities in remote rural areas came at a cost. Increased transportation expenses strained our budget, hindering our ability to extend our outreach efforts effectively. FTF is resolute in exploring innovative solutions and strategic partnerships to overcome these logistical challenges, ensuring that no community is left behind.
- Insufficient Capacity for Mental Health Support: Recognizing the importance of holistic care for survivors, FTF acknowledges the need to enhance our capacity for mental health support. We are actively working towards bolstering our resources and expertise in this crucial area, providing comprehensive and trauma-informed care that uplifts survivors on their path to healing and resilience.

FUTURE PLANS
